International Sport Management concentration

Focuses on meeting the needs of sport-related professionals who seek to work in global organizational environments that demand intercultural competencies and skills.

Recreation Administration concentration

Prepares graduates to assume mid- to upper-level administrative positions in park and recreation organizations and industries.

Sport Coaching concentration

Provides students with the advanced skills and knowledge to meet the challenges of coaching in elementary and secondary schools, colleges, and universities.

Sport and Leisure Studies concentration

Emphasizes the historical, critical, socio-cultural, and theoretical analysis of sport and leisure issues.

Sport Management concentration

Meets the growing needs and demands of a rapidly changing sport industry seeking to hire educated and culturally aware professionals.

PhD IN EDUCATION WITH AN EXERCISE, FITNESS, AND HEALTH PROMOTION SPECIALIZATION

This doctoral program cultivates research-based educators and practitioners in fields of applied kinesiology that require a balance of qualifications in exercise, fitness, and health areas.
